GOAL ORIENTED

- Last out finished fourth in the 1 3/16 miles Preakness (Grade 1) after being bumped in the stretch during the May 17 Triple Crown race.
- Unraced as a 2-year-old, he broke his maiden first time out by 3¼ lengths at Santa Anita on April 6.
- Followed that up with a win in a first-level allowance race for sophomores at 1 1/16 miles in the Churchill Downs slop on the Kentucky Derby undercard May 3.

BREEDING

- Goal Oriented is by Not This Time, who has sired three champions, including 2023 Turf Male Up To The Mark and Epicenter, the top 3-Year-Old Male in 2022.
- Not This Time has seven Grade 1 winners and 23 graded stakes winners in five crops to race.

- He sired Cogburn, who broke the North American record for 5½ furlongs on the turf in 59.80.
- Not This Time is out of Miss Macy Sue, making him a half-brother to 2015 Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile winner Liam's Map.
- Goal Oriented's paternal grandsire is Giant's Causeway, a five-time Grade 1 winner in Europe and European Horse of the Year.
- Giant's Causeway was a three-time leading North American Sire.
- Goal Oriented's dam is Bizzy Caroline, a multiple Grade 3 winner.
- She is by Afleet Alex, winner of the 2005 Preakness and Belmont and the champion 3-Year-Old Male that year.
- Bizzy Caroline has nine foals, eight to race, and Goal Oriented is her most successful.

SF RACING, STARLIGHT RACING, MADAKET STABLES, STONESTREET STABLES, DIANNE BASHOR, DETERMINED STABLES, ROBERT MASTERSON, TOM RYAN, WAVES EDGE CAPITAL, AND CATHERINE DONOVAN

- SF Racing is owned by billionaire investor George Soros and is run by Gavin Murphy and Tom Ryan.
- Starlight Racing: Partnership headed by long-time racing fans Jack and Laurie Wolf.
- Stonestreet Stables is headed by billionaire Barbara Banke, who owns the Kendall-Jackson Vineyard Estates, which include about 40 wineries in California, Ore., Chile, Italy and South Africa. The former attorney serves on the boards of the Breeders' Cup, Thoroughbred Owners & Breeders Association, and the National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame.
- Madaket is one of about a half-dozen stables owned by Sol Kumin, a financial executive.
- Diane Bashor is a philanthropist who donated \$15 million to build San Diego State University's new football stadium and the field is named Bashor Field. She and her late husband, Jim, were benefactors of the San Diego Zoo.
- Determined Stables is owned by Matt Dorman.

- Robert “Bat” Masterson is a retired computer services executive. Best known as the owner of dual champion grass mare Tepin.
- Gregg Slager owns Waves Edge Capital, an investment firm.
- Catherine Donovan is an Australian native and attorney. She is married to Gavin Murphy.
- Starlight & Kumin were part-owners of Kentucky Derby winner, Haskell winner, and Horse of the Year Authentic (2020) and Triple Crown winner Justify (2018). Both were trained by Bob Baffert.

BOB BAFFERT

- Born Jan. 13, 1953 in Nogales, Arizona.
- Haskell Record: 17 9-6-2
- Baffert holds the record for most Haskell winners with nine.
- Haskell winners: Horse of the Year Authentic (2020), Triple Crown champion and Horse of the Year American Pharoah (2015), Bayern (2014), Paynter (2012), Coil (2011), Lookin at Lucky (2010), Roman Ruler (2005), War Emblem (2002), Point Given (2001).
- This is his 18th Haskell entrant: Arabian Knight 2024 (3rd); Taiba 2022 (2nd), Authentic 2020 (1st), Mucho Gusto 2019 (2nd), American Freedom 2016 (2nd), American Pharoah 2015 (1st), Bayern 2014 (1st), Power Broker 2013 (2nd), Paynter 2012 (1st), Coil 2011 (1st), Lookin At Lucky 2010 (1st), Roman Ruler 2005 (1st), War Emblem 2002 (1st), Point Given 2001 (1st), Captain Steve 2000 (2nd), Forestry 1999 (3rd), Anet 1997 (2nd).
- No stranger to Monmouth Park, Baffert won the 1999 Monmouth Oaks (Grade 2) with Hall of Fame member Silverbulletday, the 2007 Breeders’ Cup Juvenile Fillies (Grade 1) with Indian Blessing, and the 2007 Breeders’ Cup Sprint (Grade 1) with Midnight Lute. Monmouth Park hosted the Breeders’ Cup in 2007.
- Became the first trainer in 37 years to capture the Triple Crown when American Pharoah ended the drought in 2015.
- Came back in 2018 to train Triple Crown winner Justify.
- Is the first and only to win “The Grand Slam” as American Pharoah also triumphed in the Breeders’ Cup Classic in his final race in 2015.
- Inducted into the National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame in 2009.
- Voted the Eclipse Award-winning trainer four times (1997-99, 2015).

- Trained 15 champions (Point Given, Lookin at Lucky, Indian Blessing, War Emblem, Silverbulletday, Midnight Lute, Silver Charm, Real Quiet, American Pharoah, Justify, Authentic, Gamine, Corniche, National Treasure, Citizen Bull) who won a combined 22 Eclipse Awards.
- Point Given (2001), American Pharoah (2015), Justify (2018), and Authentic (2020) won Horse of the Year honors.
- Owns the record for most Triple Crown wins (18).
- Has won the Kentucky Derby a record six times, the Preakness a record eight times, and the Belmont three times.
- Has 19 Breeders' Cup winners, second behind the late Hall of Famer D. Wayne Lukas and Aidan O'Brien with 20. Winners include 2014 Haskell victor Bayern, who gave him his first victory in the Classic, 2015 Haskell winner American Pharoah, and 2020 Haskell winner Authentic both also won the Classic.
- Spent his early years as a trainer of quarter horses in Arizona and Southern California but had a few Thoroughbreds in his stable in 1990.
- Gave up all his quarter horses following the 1991 California Cup races at Santa Anita where he won three events, including the California Cup Classic with Charmonnier.
- Scored his first major Thoroughbred success in 1992, winning the Breeders' Cup Sprint (Grade 1) with Thirty SLEWS.

FLAVIEN PRAT

Born: Aug. 4, 1992 in Melun, France

Haskell record: 3 0-0-1

- Won the 2024 Eclipse Award as Outstanding Jockey in what was a banner year.
- He won 56 graded stakes races last year, breaking Jerry Bailey's single-year record of 55, set in 2003.
- In 2024 won 16 Grade 1 races, including back-to-back Breeders' Cup races in the Classic (Sierra Leone) and Filly & Mare Turf (Moir).
- Won Preakness Stakes (Grade 1) on Rombauer.
- Won the 2019 Kentucky Derby (Grade 1) on Country House with the disqualification of Maximum Security, winner of the 2019 Haskell.
- Was the regular rider for 2022 Horse of the Year and Breeders' Cup Classic winner Flightline, who retired undefeated.

- Was the dominant rider on the competitive Southern California circuit. In 2022 switched his tack to the NYRA circuits for the spring and summer meets.
- Won multiple leading rider titles at both Santa Anita (in 2021 was the runaway winner with 124 wins) and Del Mar.
- Other Breeders' Cup wins: 2023 Juvenile Fillies Turf on Hard to Justify; 2019 Juvenile on Storm the Court; 2017 Dirt Mile on Battle of Midway (6th in the 2017 Haskell), 2016 Turf Sprint with Obviously (IRE).
- Has won 75 Grade 1 races in his U. S. career through July 12.
- Rode first winner in Fontainebleau, France, in September of 2009.
- Committed to riding in the United States in 2015.
- He rode his first winner in the U.S. on Jan. 15, 2010 when he guided Heavenly n' Free to victory at Santa Anita at 50-1 (\$103.40).
